## What is a Student Credit Card?

- a digital document that monitors your progress towards graduation
- each student has their own
  - can be shared and viewed by you and your parent
- is reviewed with you every Monday by you and your advisor
- Students can use it as a tool to set credit earning goals
- Credit Card Link

## Credit Check Monday

- AM and PM Credit Check every Monday (or occasional Tuesday on holiday weeks)
- School announcements
- Credit earning opportunities are announced
- Students learn who "made credit check"
- Students meet individually with their advisors and set goals for the week.

## Role of Advisor & Credit Check

- Each one of you has an assigned advisor.
  - (ask Sharlese if you do not know who it is)
- During credit check
  - Use this time to get insight to how you are progressing towards graduation
  - o find classes you should be doing more work in
  - get information about types of homework you can turn in
  - Do homework!!! School service options = can count toward ANY CLASS if you do a good job!
  - Ask any questions you might have

#### What does it mean to make credit check?

- All students have the responsibility of making at least
   2 credits a week.
- When students receive this amount of credit, they are said to have "made credit check".
  - Look at your <u>credit card</u> to check if your credit earning needs to be more to be on track to graduate on time.

# Calculating Credit

1 unit = 1 hour of work


15 units= 15 hours = 1 credit


6 units per day x 5 days per week = 30 units (2 credits) per week

3 hours per day in classes

3 hours per day of homework







# Tips to Making Credit Check


#1 attend **all** your classes regularly

(some teachers give bonus units for perfect attendance)

- #2 Complete your assignments by their due date
- #3 Identify credit earning opportunities
- You do not need to be enrolled in a class to be able to do homework for it.
- #4 **Ask for help** when you need it by attending office hours of
- teachers and paraeducator
  - #5 Turn in your **logs** each and every **Friday**

# Why is turning in logs key to making credit check?

- A large chunk of your total graduation credits come from ELECTIVES
- Logs give you elective credit
- Student Credit Card



## Types of Logs

#### PE Log

Any type of physical activity

## Reading Log

**Log**Audio books or hard copies

#### Work Log

Having a job or baby sitting

## Cooking Log

Preparing meals for yourself or family, cooking at work

#### Music

Playing an instrument, singing or writing music

## Writing

Short stories
Reflections to news
articles etc.
